Members may exhibit in more than one class, but only one exhibit per class. Color and black & white are separate class numbers. A picture may be used in one exhibit only. Color and black & white may not be mixed in same exhibit. Where a picture is self-processed, it should be so labeled.

DIVISION 2070 - ENTOMOLOGY

To exhibit in this division, you must be currently enrolled in one skill level of the entomology project. Exhibit no more than 4 items (and only 1 per class). Exhibit boxes of insect collections should be 18" by 12" for 25 insects and 18" by 24" for 50 insects. Each box should be 3 ½" to 4" deep. Boxes should be covered with Plexiglas that can be removed and collections organized by order. Preparation of each collection shall adhere to proper pinning and labeling methods as described in the 4-H entomology project materials and other recognized sources. Specimens shall be undamaged, and if moths or butterflies, the wings shall be properly spread. Spreading legs and wings of other groups is not required, but shall receive recognition if done.

Arrangements shall be neat and uniform in such a manner that anyone examining the collection can understand the groupings. Educational displays may consist of specialized groupings of insects, or related to any aspect of insect life. Displays should be presented in a clear, concise manner. The purpose of educational displays is to learn more about life cycles, biology, ecology, diversity, etc. of insects and related arthropods.

Exhibitors should be currently enrolled in one skill level of the forestry project. Exhibit up to 4 items (and only 1 per class). If leaves, stems or bark are to be exhibited, they should be identified with a label near the object on the same page.

Labels should show: (1) the proper common name;

- (1) the proper common name,(2) where collected (city and/or county);
- (3) date (day, month, and year) collected.

When exhibiting after more than one year in the project, group specimens by the year they were collected. Educational displays may consist of groupings of leaves, bark, stems, or related to any aspect of forestry. Displays should be presented in a clear, concise manner. The purpose of educational displays is to learn more about the importance of forest ecosystems and forest life.
